**WINNIPEG**, March 8, 2019 - The Winnipeg Jets announced today the third initiative by the Jets' wives and girlfriends for the 2018-19 season. The wives and girlfriends will be selling autographed "Lucky Pucks" on the Bell MTS Place concourse when the Winnipeg Jets host the San Jose Sharks on Tuesday, March 12. Net proceeds from the "Lucky Pucks" initiative go towards the Movement Centre of Manitoba.

The "Lucky Pucks" initiative is a sale of 500 limited edition Heritage pucks signed by the Jets' players for \$40 each. Jets fans have the opportunity to purchase the pucks at two locations: the Skywalk Atrium and outside Section 118. Each puck is signed by a Jets player and wrapped to keep their identity a surprise. Twenty-eight of the 500 pucks are unsigned gold ones which will grant a lucky fan one of 28 prizes: a full team signed Heritage Jets jersey, a full team signed stick, one of three signed Heritage Jets jersey from either Blake Wheeler, Dustin Byfuglien, or Tyler Myers, or one of 23 signed sticks.

The Winnipeg Jets' wives and girlfriends have chosen the Movement Centre of Manitoba as beneficiary of this effort and the proceeds from "Lucky Pucks" will help their work for individuals, including Tyler and Michela Myers' son Tristan.

"The Movement Centre of Manitoba has not only been life changing for us, but also for our son Tristan," said Michela Myers. "The improvements he has made in such a short period of time have given us hope and great excitement for Tristan's future. We are truly lucky to have found this amazing clinic and can't wait to see our little boy succeed in all aspects of life."
